Options for Recycling Used Oil Filters

YOUR GUIDE TO SAFE DISPOSAL OF USED OIL FILTERS
IN CALUMET COUNTY

Effective January 1, 2011, Wisconsin Act 86 banned oil filters and oil absorbents from landfill disposal. The law applies to individuals, farmers, businesses, commercial and industrial facilities, educational institutions and municipalities. The following list includes options where impacted people can recycle their used, drained, oil filters.

All motor vehicle filters are banned, including those from cars, trucks, buses, motorcycles, tractors, snowmobiles, ATV's, UTV's, and forklifts.



Types of absorbents banned include granular kitty litter, oil dry, sawdust, rags, wipes, toweling, absorbent pillows and pads. The only exception is for amounts less than one gallon from non-routine spills.



Recycling used oil, filters and absorbents preserves natural resources. Wisconsinites previously threw away 9 million oil filters a year with 187,000 gallons of oil in those filters, and 1.6 million gallons of oil in absorbents. Recycling them saves 4.5 million pounds of steel and considerable amounts of crude oil.



Oil filters from other sources, like hydraulic systems and other machinery are not covered under this ban. DNR encourages them to be recycled.
